Realisation December 2020



Learn what most managers dealt with in 2020 and what you can expect now in 2021.


1. What is your company size?

Almost half of the respondents work in **IT sector or Industry business**.




3. Do project managers in your company have IPMA, PMI or PRINCE2 certification?

Only less that 5% of the project managers have one of the **above-mentioned certificate**.




4. What was 2020 like for your projects compared to previous years?

Every third manager perceives the past year at least a bit better than expected.




5. What was the impact of 2020 on home office and remote work in your company?

Half of the companies witnessed a significant increase of the home-office system of work.




6. What was the impact of home office/remote work on your team productivity?

Home-office has not influenced teams' productivity.




7. How do you like managing your teams remotely or from home office?

Approach to home-office management is rather cold: only every fifth project manager enjoys it.




8. How do people on your projects like being managed remotely and work in the home office?

Being managed remotely **has neither gained success among teams** – only every fifth team member likes it more than before.




9. Did you manage to deliver all the key projects and goals as planned in 2020?

Congrats! Project managers have been generally efficient – most of us delivered projects as planned.




10. Have you unexpectedly acquired any new projects as a result of 2020 events?

Last year, the most of companies gained an unexpected projects/business.




11. Have you unexpectedly lost or given up any projects as a result of 2020 events?

Most of the companies, luckily, did not have to give up the planned projects or those in progress.




12. What was the impact of 2020 on your projects profitability?

There was **no company** to report at least 50%+ growth of project profitability the last year.




13. What was the impact on the delivery time of your projects?

Most of the companies have had "delayed delivery", due to the last year's circumstances.




14. What was the impact on the human resources of your projects?

HR departments have been **busy**: only one quarter of them reports no impact on their work and processes.




15. How did you engage freelancers and external specialists?

It seemed to be a harsh year for freelancers applying: almost 70% of teams have not included or have fired freelancers.




16. How did the salaries/bonuses change in 2020?
